In December 1970, Hikosaka laid latex on tatami floor and porch at his own room in Setagaya, Tokyo for the first time as "Floor Event No.1". Artist Mikio Koyanagi helped him and Yasunao Tone, a contemporary musician currently resides in New York, took record by taking 400 some black and white photographs.

22 photographs from this event will be shown at the exhibition.

Hikosaka continued to perform "Floor event" on and off until today.

There will be another set of 22 colour photography of "Floor Event No.3", which was taken place at Gallery 16 in Kyoto, 1972 February 22nd to 27th. It was a part of the exhibition called "3 events by Naoyoshi Hikosaka", which included following.

- 1. "Floor Event" to look at the floor
- 2. "Delivery Event" to deliver things
- 3. "Upright Sea" to see the ocean

It was the third "Floor Event" that became a part of the first "combined events". Hikosaka packed tatami mat and all the furniture into a truck and drove 500km to Kyoto. He tore down walls of Gallery 16 and placed tatami, unpacked furniture then laid latex. As the performance continued letting latex dry firm in a week, the famous Asama-Sanso Incident happened. The last day of the performance was remembered as the sensational ending of the incident framing the post-war history of Japan.
